JOIN YOUR CHAPTER ELECTION TEAM TODAY

A new year is upon us and with it comes new Arrowmen, but only if **you** are willing to devote yourself to the responsibilities that come with being an Arrowman. Each Chapter is responsible for completing elections in their Districts. With dozens of units in each district, running elections for all of them with only a 3-person election team is far from efficient. In order to avoid this familiar reality we need you to join your chapter election team today!

OA elections are preferably done during a unit's regular meeting. In order to run an election in the first place, the unit will need to have 50% of its active members present. Before the voting begins a member of the election team should explain the purpose and identity of the Order of the Arrow and what it means to be arrowmen. You should also explain the essential rules of the OA election.

A basic outline of a unit election address is as follows.

- Introduce yourself (name, unit, and OA leadership position, if you have one)
- Explain the mission and purpose of the OA. It need not be a full history lesson. Simply convey that the OA is the national honor society of the BSA, core values of OA are Brotherhood, Cheerfulness, and Service. Serve scouting and community through variety of service projects.
- Candidates should exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their everyday lives.
- A scout may vote for any combination of candidates, including himself.
- If one scout is not familiar with the candidates, he is encouraged to put his ballot in his pocket as not to negatively impact the election.
- The only ballots that count for the election are the ballots that are turned in.

Election candidates who receive votes from at least 50 percent of those who turn in ballots are elected Candidates for Induction. As a member of the election team you record all of the appropriate information on a designated form which is submitted to a designated adult leader so that it may be recorded in the lodge records.

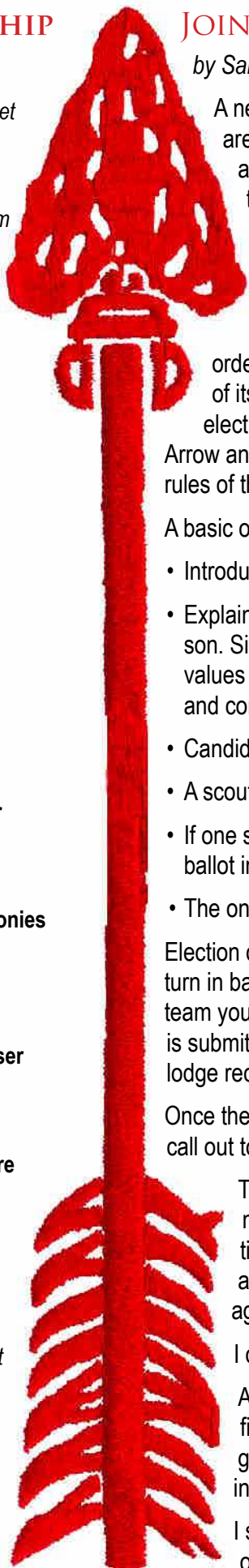
Once the results are determined, it is up to the unit to decide if they want the call out to take place at the meeting or scheduled for a later date.

These are the basic essentials of an OA Election. For additional information please reference the Nationally distributed Guide to Unit Elections as it is a great field guide for your election needs. If you encounter a situation that is not covered by the Guide to Unit Elections I encourage you to contact either your Chapter Chief, Chapter Adviser or myself.
