

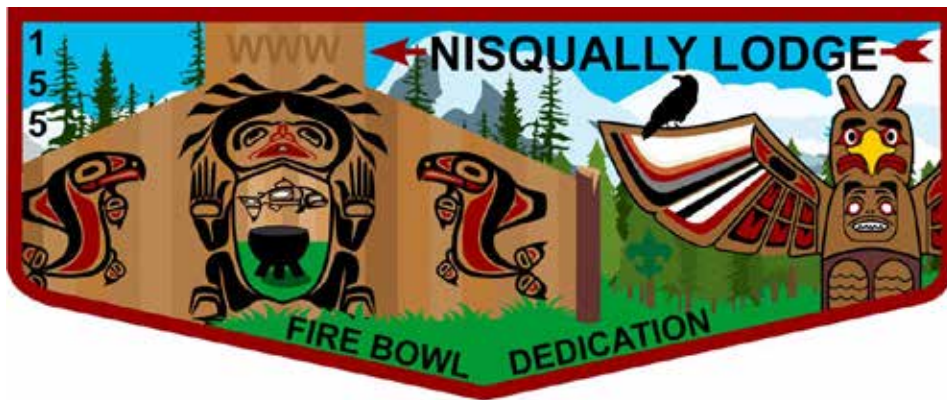

Your Brothers need you. Will you answer the call?

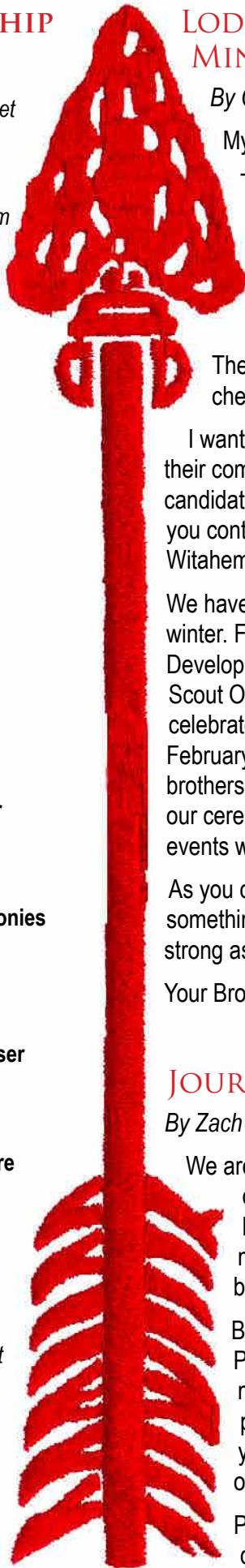
JOURNEY TO EXCELLENCE

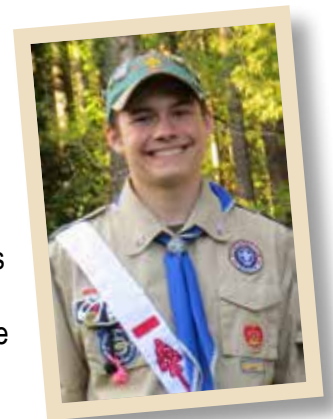
